Interviews were conducted with 1,005 Florida residents age 45 and older between July 11, 2022 and August 3, 2022. All data have been weighted by age, gender, and race/ethnicity according to 2019 U.S. Census Bureau Current Population Survey (CPS) statistics. Survey results have a 3.1% margin of error.
